Sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation


Our Parish follows the Diocese of Syracuse for the Sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation which is the same as all Parishes in the Utica area. The Sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation is a 2 year program in order to receive the sacraments. This is a requirement for both sacraments. If you have any questions, please give me a call.

There is a change for 7 & 8 Grade. This will be held at the same time as the Pre-K to 6 Grade program. Sunday from 9:50 to 10:50pm with the student welcome to attend the 11am Mass

With the approval of Fr. Mark 9th & 10th Grade-Confirmation will be a block program offered thru the Greater Utica Area - Unlike last year where registration was on 1 form for all Parishes, this year, students will be required to sign up for 9th & 10th Grade Confirmation at the Parish.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturday @3:15PM prior to Mass

Saturday Vigil Mass: 4PM Sunday: 8am and 11am

Weekdays 12:15 Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday Friday. There will no Mass on Thursday

Let's remember that as Catholics, the importance of attending Sunday Mass. At Mass we stand at mystically at the foot of the cross and witness for ourselves the same self-sacrifice of Jesus, in an unbloody manner. Mass is a celebration of this sacrifice. It is the active participation of all that come together in the place of worship.

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1st Reading: AM 7:12-15 Responsorial Psalms: 85: 9-10, 11-12, 13-14 2nd Reading: Eph 1:3-14 or 1:3-10 Gospel: Mk 6:7-13

While these are wonderful reflections, please remember that they are not to be a substitute for the wonderful sermons of Father or Deacon Kirk at Mass.

As always, I try to find wonderful reflections for this week's Gospel reading. I let the Holy Spirit guide me.



I have a number of favorite Gospel readings and this is one of them. Are your families willing to accept Christ and travel with Him.

A reading from the gospel according to Mark 6:7-13

7 Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits.

8 He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick; no food, no sack, no money in their belts.

9 They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic.

10 He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave.

11 Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them."

12 So they went off and preached repentance.

13 The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Reflection: One plus one equals three

1. Jesus sends His apostles on a training mission, not as individuals but in pairs. Their task is not easy and it would be more difficult and lonelier to go alone most especially if the people are not hospitable. There is a saying that says two heads are better than one. Yet they are not really two people. It's actually two plus the Spirit of the Lord. During His ascension, he commanded them to go to the whole world and promised that He will be with them until the end of time. Whenever we do the work of God, let us always remember that His Spirit is with us.

2. Jesus instructs His apostles to take nothing for the journey. His message was and still is trust. He is in effect telling them not to worry because all their needs will be provided. They should instead focus on their mission. God's provision is more than enough. Just like Saint Paul, they are to remember always that His grace is sufficient (2 Corinthians 12:9).

3. Jesus wants His apostles to wear sandals and not to bring with them a second tunic. This is simplicity at its best. His message is for them to serve as He has served – not attracting attention to themselves but to make people turn to God

Reflections:

- 1. The message of the Lord is to travel light in the journey of life.
- 2. Wealth, desire for recognition, and personal pride can hinder our relationship with God and our ability to love and do good.
- 3. We are passing through this world for a short time, so we should make the most of it for ourselves and others.

- 4. St. Mark highlights how the apostles anointed the sick, which is the origin of the sacrament of anointing.
- 5. This sacrament demonstrates the Lord's power of building up, not tearing down

This week's Saints of the week:

The saints are models of human excellence, perfected by the life of Christ and the communication of his Spirit. They demonstrate in their lives how to really live and how to really die. They consistently point to the horizon of love which leads to the fulfillment of all human desire: eternal communion with the Holy Trinity.

Theme Telling others about Jesus

Object: A suitcase

Scripture

These were his instructions: "Take nothing for the journey except a staff—no bread, no bag, no

money in your belts. Wear sandals but not an extra tunic. Mark 6:8-9 (NIV)

It's the time of year when many people are going on vacation. If you have ever gone on a trip, you know that it takes a lot of preparation to get ready to go. You may need to get someone to

bring in your newspaper and your mail while you are gone. If you have a dog or a cat, someone has to take care of your pet. Probably the most important thing you have to do when you go on a trip is pack your suitcase. I brought a suitcase today. Let's imagine that we are going on a trip and make a list of all of the things we will need to pack in our suitcase. Let's see, we will need socks, underwear, jeans, shirts, shorts, toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, comb and brush, and a swimsuit and flip-flops for the beach. Have I forgotten anything? (Allow time for the children to add to the list.) Oh, I thought of something I forgot. My laptop! I can't go a week without checking my email or surfing the Internet!

When he was on the earth, Jesus traveled around from village to village teaching, healing people, and casting out demons. One day, he called his twelve disciples to him and said, "I want you to go out two by two. I am giving you all of the authority you need to cast out evil spirits."

That sounds like a pretty big task, doesn't it? That meant that they would have to travel from town to town just as Jesus had been doing. I imagine the disciples thought to themselves, "Wow! I had better go home and start packing!"

But then Jesus gave them further instructions. "Take nothing for your journey except a walking stick -- no food, no traveler's bag, and no money. You can wear sandals, but no extra clothing."

No food, no money, no extra clothes -- how could the disciples possibly make this journey? They found people who would welcome them and they stayed with them in their homes. These people fed them and gave them everything they needed for the journey. The Bible tells us that the disciples went out telling everyone they met to repent of their sins and turn to God. They also cast out many evil spirits and they healed many sick people. In other words, they did exactly what Jesus told them to do and he gave them the power to do it.

Jesus told you and me to go and make disciples. I wonder if sometimes we delay following his command because we think we aren't ready. If we would just go, like the Twelve did, he would give us the ability to share the Good News with others. What do you think? Let's go!

Father, we know that many people need to hear the Good News. Jesus has told us to go and make disciples. Help us to be willing to go. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
