Please remember that your child faith formation does not end with a year's program. Share your faith with your children until the 2024-2025 year begins in September. Attending Mass is a wonderful way to continue your family faith journey.

The program for 2024-2-2025 has been completed and will begin on September $22^{\rm nd}$

There was no change in the time for the Pre-K to 6th Grade. It will be on Sundays from 9:50am to 10:50am with the families welcome to attend the 11am Mass. The program will be focused on more family Catechesis.

In order to properly order enough material for their program, I am taking early registration. The cost is the same as last year: \$25 for 1 child and \$45 for a family. If you wish to pre-register your family for the program, please contact me directly at 315-527-8399.

Our Parish follows the Diocese of Syracuse for the Sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation which is the same in all Parishes in the Utica area. The Sacrament of First Communion and Confirmation is a 2 year program in order to receive the sacraments. This is a requirement for both sacraments. If you have any questions, please give me a call.

There is a change for 7 & 8 Grade. This will be held at the same time as the Pre-K to 6 Grade program. Sunday from 9:50 to 10:50pm with the student welcome to attend the 11am Mass

With the approval of Fr. Mark 9th & 10th Grade-Confirmation will be a block program offered thru the Greater Utica Area - Unlike last year where registration was on 1 form for all Parishes, this year, students will be required to sign up for 9th & 10th Grade Confirmation at the Parish.

Let's remember that as Catholics, the importance of attending Sunday Mass. At Mass we stand at mystically at the foot of the cross and witness for ourselves the same self-sacrifice of Jesus, in an unbloody manner. Mass is a celebration of this sacrifice. It is the active participation of all that come together in the place of worship.

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1st Reading: Jer 23:1-6 Responsorial Psalms: 23:1-6, 3-4, 5, 6 2nd Reading: Eph 2:3-18 Gospel: MK 6:30-34

While these are wonderful reflections, please remember that they are not to be a substitute for the wonderful sermons of Father or Deacon Kirk at Mass.

As always, I try to find wonderful reflections for this week's Gospel reading. I let the Holy Spirit guide me.



- 30 The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught.
- 31 He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat.
- 32 So they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place.
- 33 People saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them.
- 34 When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

Reflection: There is a time to work hard and a time to rest and reflect.

The apostles were excited to report what they have accomplished. When the time comes, we too will give to our creator a report of what we have done in our earthly life. What would be the content of our reports? How many pages?

Have we done a lot or too little?

Jesus tells His apostles to go to the deserted place and rest for a while. Are you a workaholic with no time even to eat and to rest? Even church workers, pastors and priests included, are sometimes too absorbed in their work that they even forget their prayer time. Jesus himself showed that from time to time, He went to a deserted place to pray alone or with a few companions. We too should also find time to get away from the crowds in order to have time for rest and reflection.

Jesus made Himself available to people who are in need. He knew how to balance His schedule. Are you that worker who is difficult to approach? Indeed, there is a time to say

yes to people and there is a time to say no. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to give us the gift of discernment so that we can be able to determine the proper course of action in every situation.

The Good News is that Jesus understands all our needs, especially our need to be taught of His ways. He is easily moved with pity for us. May we have pity on others too and make ourselves available to them in their hour of need.

After the Apostles came back from their first training mission, Jesus saw how tired they were and invited them to have a rest. He wanted them to be away from the crowd yet the people still chased them and in fact, arrived first before Jesus and His Apostles.

We all get tired from work and from problems. We get weary and weak from exhaustion. Sometimes, our fatigue is due to the enormous task we impose on ourselves. The gospel tells us that the Lord truly understands our physical limitations and He urges us to take a rest. In Matthew 11:28, He says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Many people work as if there is no tomorrow. Even if Sunday is declared a day of rest, a lot of people still go to work on this day. Working overtime and many times skipping meals in order to finish a report on time is indeed detrimental not only to physical but also mental and emotional health. Hence, the invitation of Jesus to "rest for a while" is to recharge not only our body but more so our spirit and thus preserve our sanity.

To rest for a while means it is a temporary thing. We rest so that we can have more energy to continue working. It means to retreat but not to give up. We rest so that Jesus can fill up or rather refill our depleted strength. Resting when tired is much like having a retreat when our faith is weakening. In the gospel reading above, Jesus is telling us to go to a place away from the hustle and bustle of city life, to have a retreat in a deserted place so that we can be able to focus on Him, to a secluded place where He can teach us many things because nothing can be able to disturb us.

This week's Saints of the week:

The saints are models of human excellence, perfected by the life of Christ and the communication of his Spirit. They demonstrate in their lives how to really live and how to really die. They consistently point to the horizon of love which leads to the fulfillment of all human desire: eternal communion with the Holy Trinity.

July 23rd Feast of Saint of Mary Magdalene

How many of you have taken a vacation? (Invite the children to share where they went and what they did. As children share, point out aspects of rest in each child's story.) I've been on vacation too. I brought some pictures that I took while I was on vacation. (Briefly describe where you went and something you did to relax.)

We all need to get away sometimes. Even Jesus said that we sometimes need to take some time off to get caught up on our rest. The Bible tells about a time the disciples went to Jesus and told Him how busy they had been teaching and ministering to the needs of people. "There have been so many people coming and going that we didn't even have time to stop and eat," they told Jesus. (Have kids pretend to eat and then stop abruptly.)

"Come with me to a quiet place so that you can get some rest," Jesus said to the disciples. (Have kids pretend to sleep.) So the Bible tells us that they got in a boat. (Have kids pretend to row a boat.) And they went away with Jesus to a quiet place.

Yes, we all need a time to get away, even Jesus and His friends needed to rest!

Dear God, thank You for work, for play, and for school. We also thank You for those times when we can get away from it all and get some rest. In Jesus' name, amen.
